Ordo Amoris (from St. Augustine's explanation about Rightly Ordered Love, or the order of love)

On this last Sunday of October, we are invited to reflect upon the two greatest commandments – love for God, and love for our neighbor. As Jesus summarizes the great Decalogue (Ten Commandments), he emphasizes the effects of these commandments, that people can live in harmony and lasting peace through the design of God which is contained in said law from God. Love for God is the foundation of all ordinances, because God has ordained from the beginning, to the present, and until the end of all things, his creation to be in order, to endure to realize its fullness. Fellowship is not complete with just God as the center of praise and adoration; it is also communitarian, for no one can claim to love God, if one does not love thy neighbor the way God loves that neighbor as well. If we know that the fruit of God's love is everything around us, including our neighbor, we will also practice the order of love in an orderly manner. By practicing the order of love in an orderly manner, we will also realize how Jesus in his great love prioritized the salvation of humanity for the justification of all created things.

May we be inspired by the words of St. Bernard to his community of monks as to why we must not be selfish in loving God, but instead, to have an openness to see the reflection of God not just around us, but also in fellowship with others: "We must deny our selfish passions, grow in thankfulness for God's love to us, become captivated by God's nature of love, and ultimately lose ourselves in God."

All Souls Day remembrance envelope is available on the table in the back of the church. In the month of November, in the Holy Sacrifice of the daily masses, we remember the departed souls.

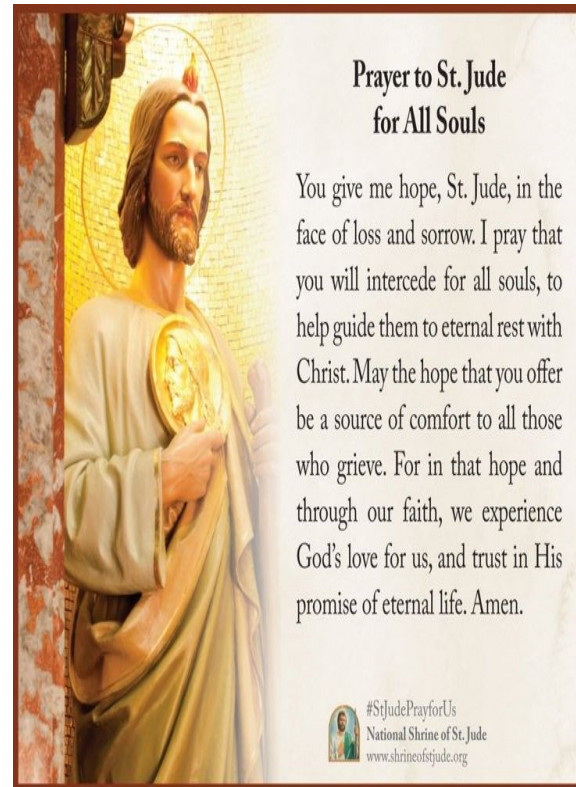
All Saints Day Prayer

What is a "First Friday"?

FATHER FRANCIS HOFFMAN

A "First Friday" is the first Friday of the month and is often marked by special devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus since Jesus died for us and won our salvation on a Friday. Every Friday of the year, and not only the Fridays in Lent, is a special day of penance as stipulated in the Code of Canon Law: "The penitential days and times in the universal Church are every Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent" (Canon 1250).
