Divitiae in Divina Paupertate

Being generous, regardless of whether we are rich or poor, is the topic of reflection on this Sunday. Generosity is not measured by the amount one gives, but by the disposition which prompts the giving. Being rich, being poor – while material wealth and money are not the only factors that determine what a person can offer, it is the standard of the world to have both extremes, a new caste in the system of post-modern society. Those who can and those who cannot, those who can catch up and those that are good to be left behind. In the eyes of God, all our richness in the world is just surplus of His love. His real outpouring of love is directed not to nature, but to the beings He gifted His image, and through Jesus, He willingly shared our humanity. For us, the highest form of richness and generosity must be the loving disposition toward others, our poverty is relating to others as human beings in the same journey towards God. Such spiritual richness, and conscientious poverty will never be affected by any economic crisis, because it is meritorious in the bank of God. In this Eucharistic celebration, let us ask for the grace to know real treasures and to seek authentic poverty as exulted in the words of St Thomas Aquinas, “Richness in heavenly poverty!”

Decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary on Plenary Indulgences for the deceased faithful, 28.10.2021

D E C R E E

THE Apostolic PENITENTIARY, having listened to the various pleas recently received from various Sacred Pastors of the Church, due to the continuing state of the pandemic, confirms and extends for the entire month of November 2021 all the spiritual benefits already granted on 22 October 2020, through the Decree Protocol No. 791/20/I with which, due to the "Covid-19" pandemic, the Plenary Indulgences for the deceased faithful were extended for the entire month of November 2020.

From the renewed generosity of the Church, the faithful will certainly draw pious intentions and spiritual vigour to guide their lives according to the Gospel law, in filial communion and devotion to the Supreme Pontiff, the visible foundation and Pastor of the Catholic Church. This Decree is valid for the entire month of November, notwithstanding any provision to the contrary.
