May our thoughts be as one.

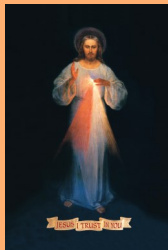
May our ears listen to the silence together.

the face of the earth.

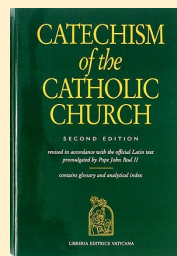

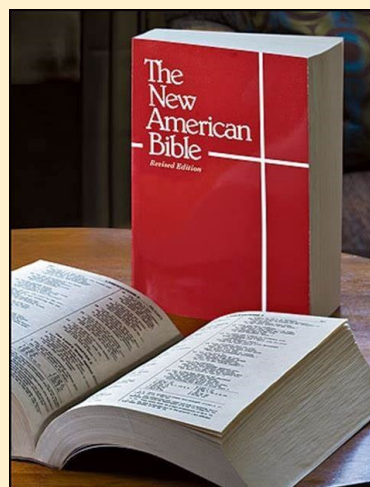

The readings on the 15th Sunday in Ordinary time, (Am 7:12-15/ Eph 1:3-14/ Mk 6:7-13) we are reminded that the nature of the church as a Church is missionary and those who make up the body of the church are directed towards mission in their particular way, according to the time, talent, treasure of each parts. From the very beginning, the Lord Jesus formed, instructed, and sent his apostles to preach the good news, to drive out demons, and take care of the weak and the sick, to lead those walking in darkness to the right path of truth. Father Norlito Concepcion is an Augustinian priest from Intramuros, Manila. The oldest of three brothers, he is 14 years professed and eight years ordained.

Fr. Norlito brings a wealth of experience. Right after his ordination, he volunteered for the missions. Six months later, he was sent to Costa Rica; and then to El Salvador.

Prior to coming to St. Pius X, Fr. Norlito was at Hamakua Catholic Community (Immaculate Heart Of Mary in Papaikou,

St. Anthony in Laupahoehoe, and Good Shepherd Mission in Honouliuli). He has also served: on Kauai, at St. John Church in Mililani, at St. George Church in Waimanalo, and at the Cathedral Basilica of Our Lady of Peace. He has also been assigned to Hospital Ministry with outreach as the chaplain for Straub Medical Center and Kaiser Permanente.



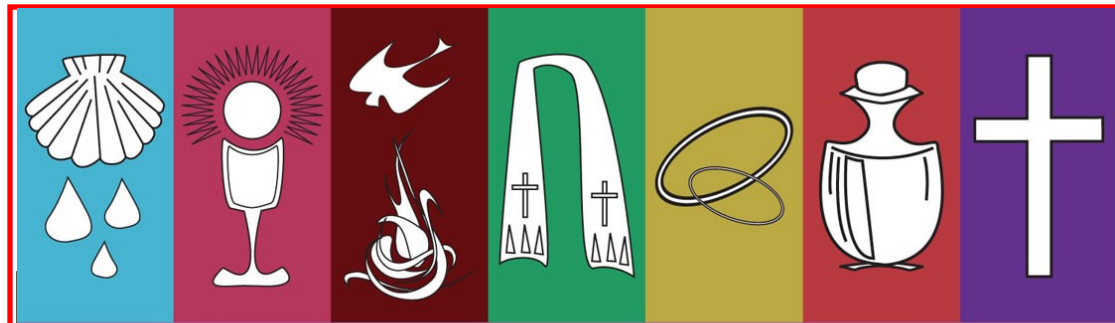
