

# SACRAMENTS

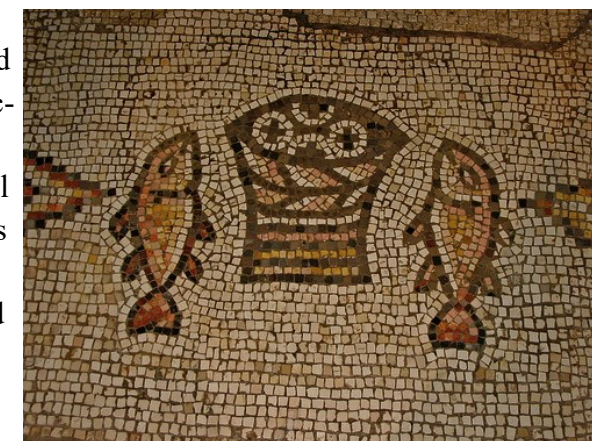
### July 25, 17<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time



The multiplication of loaves found in the Gospel of John is the initial action of Jesus efforts to bring us closer to the revelation of him as the Living Bread, the Bread Of Life. While the people are expecting to have a king who will rule them and rescue them from their enslavement by a foreign power, Jesus doesn't fit to their expectations as he was a savior higher than the aspirations of the people. He is the Living Bread, more nourishing than that of what Elijah received from the angel that gave him strength for his journey on a land devastated by famine. Jesus as the Bread of Life is even greater than the manna that the Israelites received on their 40 years journey in the desert during the time of Moses, for even if they have eaten the bread that came from heaven, death still came to decimate them.

The multiplication of loaves is a foreshadow of the saving Bread Of Life which is Jesus himself, the only Eucharist which binds us in communion with the Church on earth and in heaven, our food for the spiritual journey in the present and to our end in the Heavenly Kingdom. The food that assures us of the resurrection as Jesus glorified in all his essence and existence will come again to take the seat as the Sovereign ruler when he comes to judge the living and the dead.

Beatitudes Of Evangelization

Our Confirmation calls us to bring others to JESUS. A lot of Catholics want to spread the Faith, but they don't know where to start. Using the following principles will not only bring others to JESUS, they will bless your life.

**Blessed Are They Who Encounter.** (Matthew 6:33)

Evangelization starts with yourself. This means re-encountering JESUS, and getting so excited about your Faith, that others will want it too. Such excitement can be lit by attending a Retreat, Conference, Healing Service...

**Blessed Are They Who Care.** (1 Timothy 2:1)

Pray for others. Pray for them daily. Include them in your intentions when you pray a Rosary or Chaplet of Divine Mercy, or attend Mass. Befriend the people you pray for (John 13:34). First, listen to their story. Evangelization is not about numbers, it's about love.

**Blessed Are They Who Abide.** (John 15:5)

Stay closely connected to JESUS through: frequent reception of the Sacraments; daily reading of Sacred Scripture; and quiet prayer—quiet yourself and wait on GOD to commune to you.

**Blessed Are They Who Go Out.** (Mark 16:15)

Go outside of your comfort zone. Bear the fruit of the HOLY SPIRIT (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, generosity, self-control). Preach the Gospel and if necessary use words. Give JESUS and the Church credit for that Fruit. When asked... "How are you?" Respond, "I'm blessed." "Why are you so peaceful... joyful... loving...?" Reply, "I encountered JESUS at Mass."

**Blessed Are They Who Invoke The HOLY SPIRIT** (2 Timothy 1:6)

Just before evangelizing, Ask the HOLY SPIRIT to flow through you, love through you, minister through you. Rely on HIM to invigorate you, lead you, empower you.

**Blessed Are They Who Witness:** (John 1:41-42)

"Briefly" share the Story of Salvation (John 3:16) and how GOD will help them if they give HIM a chance. Follow up quickly with your **personal testimony**—the story of your life changing encounter with JESUS. Afterwards, pray out loud with them by name. Invite them to join you at Mass. Finally, give them a tangible reminder of GOD's Love (Rosary, Picture of the Divine Mercy, Miraculous Medal...)

**Blessed Are They Who Move With The SPIRIT.** (Acts 13:4)

There are many ways to evangelize. Allow the HOLY SPIRIT to guide you. Don't be afraid to Evangelize through Social Media. Share very briefly of your encounters with CHRIST

**Blessed are they who Accompany.** (Luke 24:13-31)

Don't just invite, bring them with you to: Daily Mass, Church, Retreat, Healing Service. Make yourself available to them. Be ready to provide basic catechesis and don't be afraid to refer them to someone who can answer their questions (once again, accompanying them).
