

Saint Albertus Magnus'

followed the instruction of the Blessed Virgin Mother and became the most significant German philosopher and theologian in the Medieval Period. St. Albertus Magnus, the oldest son of a wealthy lord in Bollstadt. Germany, and was born in his family's castle at Lauingen (now Bavaria, Germany) sometime in 1205 or 1206. Feast Day November 15.

This is a First Class Relic on Display in the Sanctuary

There are three classes of sacred relics. The first-class is a part of the saints body. The secondclass is a piece of the saints clothing or something used by the saint, while the third-class is an object which has been touched to a first-class relic.

- **St. Dominic**, Spanish in full Santo Domingo de Guzmán, (born c. 1170, Caleruega, Castile [Spain]—died August 6, 1221, Bologna, Romagna [Italy]; canonized July 3, 1234; feast day August 8), founder of the Order of Friars Preachers (Dominicans), a mendicant religious order with a universal mission of preaching, a centralized organization and government, and a great emphasis on scholarship. Feast day August 8
- **St. Martin de Porres**, Martin's life reflected his great love for God and all of God's gifts. It is said he had many extraordinary abilities, including aerial flights, bilocation, instant cures, miraculous knowledge, spiritual knowledge and an excellent relationship with animals. Martin also founded an orphanage for abandoned children and slaves and is known for raising dowry for young girls in short amounts of time. During an epidemic in Lima, many of the friars in the Convent of the Rosary became very ill. Locked away in a distant section of the convent, they were kept away from the professed. However, on more than one occasion, Martin passed through the locked doors to care for the sick. However, he became disciplined for not following the rules of the Convent, but after replying, "Forgive my error, and please instruct me, for I did not know that the precept of obedience took precedence over that of charity," he was given full liberty to follow his heart in mercy. 
