The Cross of Jesus, Our Hope and Salvation

This Sunday celebration reminds us of the duty which all of us must fulfill, to take up our cross and carry it in the footsteps of our Lord Jesus Christ. A task that doesn't give pleasure and earthly rewards, for the cross always entails some degree of suffering that leads to death. We instinctively choose pleasures and comports that gives us the sense we are enjoying life. Yet, the cross looms large on the horizon of our earthly existence and to ignore it leads to loss of life's meaning and loss of the right path. It may be the cross of sickness, of natural defects, of failures, or of injustices inflicted on us, or it may be the cross of living out the demands of our faith, as apostle St. James revealed to us on his letter, (Jas 2:14-18) for some, it's the symbol of humiliation, defeat, an absurdity that deserves ridicule because it demands work and great sacrifice. Part of the cross is bearing with one another's shortcomings within our own family, in our place of work, in our communities, because it maybe our cross, but it's a share of our Lord to us. The cross is the symbol of Our Lords' victory, reminding us always that the cross is the great solid bridge to heaven, a ladder towards where angels and Saints can ascend and descend to aid the faithful living, the dead wood of the cross where the precious blood of Jesus was spilled to make its grow for the nourishment and renewal to those who will partake of its, the Holy Eucharist.


