Being unable to hear and speak is a handicap, in the words of St. Thomas Aquinas as "physical evil" because God did not ordain his creation to be incomplete, but rather "full of Potentiality." But even worse than physical deafness and dumbness are the spiritual "handicapness" – inability or the unwillingness to hear God's Word, to neglect God's will, to render what is fitting and due for God's image in others, the disrespect of the humanity of Jesus in the human dignity of others, and to respond to it, or the refusal to hear the pleas of our neighbor, the refusal to see and respond to it with compassion and love. Jesus, restoring the gifts of hearing and speech to the deaf and mute man, He can also perform the even greater miracle of healing the spiritually deaf and mute among us. St. Damien and St. Marianne Cope dedicated their lives to service of those who had an infectious disease. St. Marianne Cope said, “I am not afraid of any disease,” because she was confident of your power to save. At the same time, she took prudent precautions of hygiene to assure that she and her Sisters would not be infected.

Let us learn from this example to put our trust in you to save us from the ravages of disease and to take prudent measures to prevent its spread.
