We celebrate the Solemnity of Señor Sto. Niño de Cebu, the

500 years enduring icon of faith of the Philippine archipelago. The Flemish image of the Child Jesus given as a gift in baptism to the wife of Rajah Humabon on April 14, 1521 by Ferdinand Magellan. The image of the child Jesus that not only introduced Christianity to south-east, that established the springboard of Catholic evangelization to the Asian far east and the pacific, the image of the Child Jesus of Cebu also founded the "Pueblo Amante De Maria," (The people that loves Mary) to be distinct in character among the daughters of the Holy Church.
