In the Council in New Batavia (Jakarta), the Dutch decided to launch a decisive attack in the Philippines. Saints Louis Martin and Zélie Guérin

Born into a military family in Bordeaux, Louis trained to become a watchmaker. His desire to join a religious community went unfulfilled because he didn't know Latin. Moving to Normandy, he met the highly-skilled lace maker, Zélie Guérin, who also had been disappointed in her attempts to enter religious life. They married in 1858, and over the years were blessed with nine children, though two sons and two daughters died in infancy.



Louis managed the lace-making business that Zélie continued at home while raising their children. She died from breast cancer in 1877.

Louis then moved the family to Lisieux to be near his brother and sister-in-law, who helped with the education of his five surviving girls. His health began to fail after his 15-year-old daughter entered the Monastery of Mount Carmel at Lisieux in 1888. Louis died in 1894, a few months after being committed to a sanitarium.

The home that Louis and Zélie created nurtured the sanctity of all their children, but especially their youngest, who is known to us as Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus. Tria Haec: Fides (Faith)

Faith is “free assent to the whole truth that God has revealed.” Faith is not a “what” but “has,” because in the creation of Humanity, we are already subject to it. Faith is how we relate to God. Denial of “Faith” is a folly because we all desire to live and to live it “Good.” Even without “faith,” we can live and we can desire to live and even to die for the Truths of the Living Gospel if we have “Faith.” As Catholics, we always chose to live because we have “Faith” that it is “True.” There is a reason why many fall in despair when they lose their “faith,” because they were not able to assent to “Faith” the apostles are asking Jesus to increase their faith despite of being in the company of Jesus and witnessing His Wonderful and Good “Works.” (Opus) The Apostles only have trust, and they have not yet developed loyalty and obedience to Jesus. It is obvious when Jesus was arrested and was crucified. They completely lost trust in Jesus after his arrest. It will only assent into loyalty and obedience when Jesus took a higher state after His resurrection, especially when they received the power of the Holy Spirit.
