

came a favorite disciple and heiress of Teresa's spirit, just as the prophet Elisha was of the great seer Elijah. Such are the processes of the cause of Blessed Anne. Acting as a secretary, she accompanied Santa Teresa on her founding raids. And the Saint, recognizing the value of her personal service and her extraordinary holiness, came to tell her:

"Ana, Ana, you have the works, I have the fame."

She learned to write in a miraculous way. She always stood out for her extraordinary charity, both towards God and towards her neighbor. In her autobiography we read that she longed to die of love and sighed for this joy. Hers is the phrase: "Oh, how heavy this body is! And I'm tired of taking care of it, all I wish would be to see these chains broken!" When Santa Teresa died, she went to France, where she founded several convents, giving marvelous examples of all the virtues. In her Autobiography, written by obedience, she left us a record of the many mystical graces that she enjoyed during her life, as a result of her great love for the Humanity of Jesus and for the Mystery of the Most Holy. Faith is an entirely free gift that God makes to man. We can lose this priceless gift, as St. Paul indicated to St. Timothy: "Wage the good warfare, holding faith and a good conscience. By rejecting conscience, certain persons have made shipwrecks of their faith. "To live, grow and persevere in the faith until the end, we must nourish it with the word of God; we must beg the Lord to increase our faith; it must be "working through charity," abounding in hope, and rooted in the faith of the Church. (CCC162) From one of the definitions of faith in the Catechism of The Catholic Church, our perseverance in keeping the freely given gift of Faith is our form of gratitude to God who gives us faith that we do not deserve. All creation shows gratitude to God in their own ways, while we Humans express our gratitude with actions, and one action of our gratitude is the proper use and even conservation of what we received. The same thing is expected of us in taking care of our God given Faith.
