We declare, pronounce, and define that the doctrine which holds that the most Blessed Virgin Mary, in the first instance of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege granted by Almighty God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin, is a doctrine revealed by God and therefore to be believed firmly and constantly by all the faithful. (Defined by Pope Pius-IX in *Ineffabilis Deus* in 1854)



Originating in the 7th c. feast of the "Conception of Mary by St. Anne." Pope Clement XI, in his Bull, *Commissi Nobis*, established this solemnity for the entire Church (1708). Declared Principal Patroness of the Philippines by Pope Pius XII in 1942. Catherine Labouré stated that on 18 July 1830, that the Blessed Virgin instruct her to commission a medal that declares Her Sinless, and in 1858, of which Bernadette Soubirous (age 14) the "Lady" spoke to her in the cave of Massabielle, France, the Blessed Virgin declare that She is the Immaculate Conception. 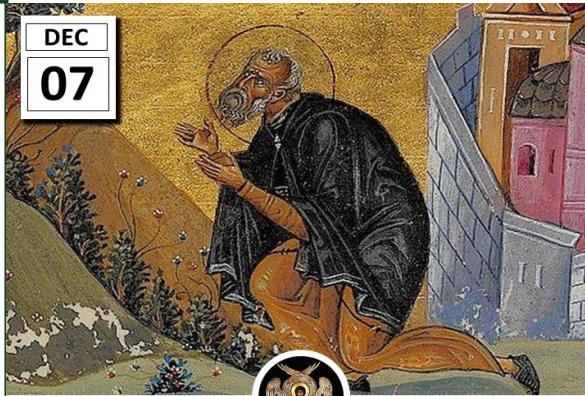

Saint Burgundofara

She is also known as St. Fara. She was a Frankish Benedictine abbess. St. Columbanus, when received in her father's house, in her childhood, saw her carry in her hand a bouquet of wheat instead of flowers. He predicted that the wheat of the elect would be the portion of this little virgin, and that Jesus Christ destined her to love no man but himself. This came true when she became a nun and an abbess for 37 years.

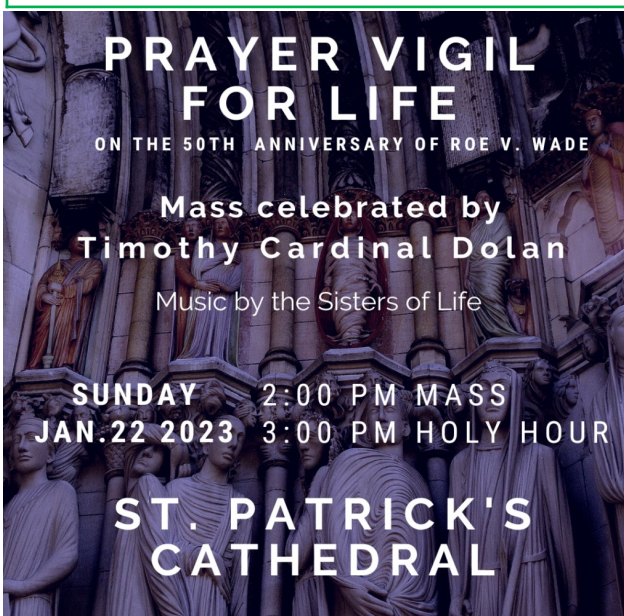
