The Call to Heroic Virtue

Our culture has a very confused sense of heroism, often ap-plauding the biggest, strongest, loudest, or wealthiest. Blockbuster movies and an endless parade of celebrities and sports figures dominate the mainstream representation of heroes.

Heroism is developed over time, one decision after another, moment by moment, formed by a deliberate, chosen, and habitual response to life.

A hero is cultivated by countless — often unnoticed — actions. Heroes are not made by a spider's bite or on an alien planet.

They are ordinary humans — you and me — who direct their decisions and actions to be strengthened by goodness, compassion, integrity, and righteousness. They are the ones who are willing to venture out of the safe harbor of what is comfortable and venture into the wild, untamable sea of God's calling.

In other words, the hero's journey is one of deep virtue.

There are two types of virtues proposed by the Catholic Church: the cardinal virtues and the theological virtues.

~ The cardinal virtues — also called the moral, human, or natural virtues — are....

- -- iustice.
- -- temperance,
- -- prudence, and
 - -- fortitude.

The three theological virtues — also called the spiritual or Godward virtues — as described by St. Paul, are...

- -- faith.
- -- hope, and
 - -- love.

Each virtue plays an **important role in our relationship with God and others**, and each calls us deeper into the wave of God's unexpected adventure for our lives.

By choosing to live virtuously, by intentionally seeking to develop the seven virtues in our lives and hearts, we are choosing to immerse ourselves in God's Will.

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Jesus and the Dialogue of Man with God

The Second Sunday of Lent takes us on a pilgrimage atop Mt. Tabor to witness the great transfiguration of the Judge-Provider (Pantokrator), Jesus. During breaks in our Lenten pilgrimage (which is characterized by penance and greater awareness of our sinfulness), Jesus encourages us with the foretaste of what is to come. Our weak and wounded humanity doesn't end with death on the wood of the Cross, but the dead wood can spring forth new buds of green, and like Moses's encounter with God in the burning bush, our hopes are not as desolate as that of the dry soil during the days of Elijah, when God closed the heavens and prevented rain from falling on the ground. So, we fix our gaze on the transfigured Christ, to see the source of our inspiration and hope, the splendor of a holy life in heaven that moved the heart of Peter to convince Jesus and His admirable companions, Moses and Elijah, to stay.

Let us remember that Jesus, in His dialogue with the Father, was transfigured while He was praying. As we participate in the Eucharist, may we be transformed too, as people of heaven on earth. May our practice of the Lenten tradition allow us to bring down heaven to a world full of hopelessness and insecurities.

Pope Francis streamlined the process to petition for a declaration of nullity to make the process shorter. He also eliminated the mandatory fee. If a person is able to prove in this process that their prior marital bond was invalid for some reason, then he or she can marry in the Catholic Church or validate a current civil marriage.
