Blessed Are the Merciful, for They Shall Find Mercy

This Sunday, we look back at the unforgettable example of Jesus, who offered His forgiveness and restored dignity to the adulterous woman who had been dragged in front of Him in shame and fear. The so-called proud, chosen people of God did this to entrap Jesus, and to teach Jesus the lesson that authority lies with them. Jesus, who is God Himself, showed them how the Divine dispenses real mercy, prompting us to go back to the Lord's word, "Be perfect as your Father in Heaven is perfect." According to St. Peter Chrysologus, "The perfection of God is manifested in the mercy of Jesus," and indeed, Jesus practiced real mercy, because He did not condemn the woman to a brutal end by stoning, but instead, allowed her to continue proceeding with her life in the way of repentance.

The teaching of mercy and forgiveness was conveyed last Sunday through the parable of the prodigal son. This Sunday, we see how it is offered to us through an example from real life. We must ask ourselves two important questions: do we judge others out of our self-righteousness like the scribes; and do we allow those who walk in the darkness of error to proceed to their doom just like the Pharisees? Merciless people judge out of their pride and refuse to correct those in error by condemning them to their doom. The challenging sentence, "Let the one among you who has no sin be the first to cast a stone," is not directed only to the hypocritical scribes and Pharisees of the time of Jesus. It is meant also for us who easily judge and condemn others. The Lenten Season reminds us that we should never forget that we, too, are frail and sinful, and that we must learn to practice real mercy if we want to enjoy God's mercy.

Unexpected conversion—John Wayne

The man we know as movie star John Wayne was born as Marion Morrison in Iowa in 1907. In 1914, his family moved West, and Marion began to be called "Duke." In the height of the Great Depression, he worked for movie

studios as a prop man, and eventually became an extra and later starred as the cowboy Breck Coleman in the 1930 film, "The Big Trail." He was renamed John Wayne by the studio to help craft a larger showing.

In the 1940s and 1950s, John Wayne starred in major Westerns and War pictures. He had four children with his first wife. In 1964, he was diagnosed with lung cancer and lost a lung and several ribs. He had two more marriages, one ending in divorce, the other lasting until his death and resulting in three children. Though he was raised Presbyterian himself, all seven of his children were raised Catholic by their mothers.

When his end was near, Wayne was in agony, succumbing to stomach cancer. A priest was called, and Wayne was baptized and the priest administered last rites. That night, Wayne fell into a coma. "I don't know the technicalities of the Church or what constitutes a conversion," said son Michael. "But Dad did die in the Church." In 1979, he died of stomach cancer at the age of 72.

Fr. Muñoz, Wayne's grandson, said that his grandfather expressed a degree of regret about not becoming a Catholic earlier in life: "that was one of the sentiments he expressed before he passed on." blaming "a busy life."

From Wayne's example, we should learn that it is never too late to embrace God's forgiveness. We should not allow a busy life, no matter how important we think the work is, to keep us from a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. Receiving the sacraments and especially weekly Mass attendance can help foster that relationship.
