




Faith Completes Belief

In the early stages of the Church, when a Christian from another church community is visiting another place and wanting to fulfill Christian obligations of the liturgy, the Christian will stand on the crossroad and will write the letter "Rho" (It resembles the modern letter "P."). If a local Christian sees it, he or she will put on top of the "Rho" the letter "Chi" (it resembles the modern letter "X."). The symbol of the "Chi-Rho" represents the Greek name of Christ, and the visiting Christian will trustingly follow the one who completed the "Symbolon" (a complete Chi-rho) to the local Christian house church. It was in Nicene in 325, the council fathers will use the same term "Symbolon," as a call to all clergy to recite the Nicene Creed. The same Creed that we now profess inside the Holy Mass.

During the Protestant Reformation on October 31, 1517 in Wittenberg, instead of maintaining the harmony of faith and belief, Fray Martin Luther shattered the early Christian and apostolic unity with the "Three Solas," (Scripture only, faith only, and grace only). Now we have people who claim to be Christians but do not subscribe to apostolic worship, (Divine liturgy and Holy Mass) and believe in Je-

sus but doesn't want to unite themselves with the apostolic tenets of the faith. (Logic, Morality, Ethics, and Dogmas)



As orthodox Catholics who belong to the Roman Latin rite of The One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Faith, we are encouraged to unite our belief with our faith. We revisit the faith of our fathers and mothers in Christian history, and add our belief "IN" it, and not just to believe in association. The Virgin Mary, the Martyrs, the Saints, those who have gone before us with the "Mark of Faith" are our heroes, our sentinels, and they are inviting us to join in their ranks by adding our "Chi" to their "Rho," to add our voices in their triumphant exclaim. "Axios!" We are worthy!



Bl. Mannes, OP

Mannes (ca. 1170-1235), an older brother of Dominic, was contemplative and holy. He placed himself under his brothers guidance at least from the foundation of the Dominican Order and perhaps even much earlier. Mannes joined the Order and was known as a fervent preacher, virtuous in his habits, meek, humble, and kind. He later helped establish the priory of St. Jacques in Paris in 1217, and in 1219 he was entrusted with the care of the Dominican nuns at Madrid. After his death many miracles were attributed to his intercession. More is known about Mannes than Dominic's other siblings. It is believed that Felix de Guzman and Jane of Aza had three sons and perhaps one daughter, for two of Dominic's nephews also joined the Order. Dominic's oldest brother, Anthony, was a diocesan priest in a hospice and devoted himself unreservedly to works of mercy in the service of the poor.
