



Stewardship Corner

In the past writings on stewardship, the meaning and purpose of the Three T's of Stewardship was an attempt to encourage and develop an understanding of Time, Talent and Treasure.

Now we are discussing Stewardship on a Parish community established on the elements of the Four Pillars: *Hospitality, Prayer, Formation, and Service*.

Hospitality:

"When I was a stranger, you welcomed me" (Mt. 25:35). Simple kindness and a smile are the first ways to be Christ-like to others. Have we practiced it in church and elsewhere lately? Other non-denominational churches are growing because they make their churches welcoming places. Make your church where people feel welcomed, loved and cared about. Make an effort to welcome a visitor.

Prayer:

When we spend time in prayer, we show God that He is the most important person at the moment. Mass is to connect with God in a personal way. To ensure that liturgies are reverent, the quality of music, lectors, ushers, greeters and Extraordinary Ministers must be well trained to provide a holy experience. This has been the goal at St. Pius X.

Formation:

It is the opportunity to learn more about God from quality formational resources available to us. Scripture studies, catechesis and other forms of faith education should be offered to every age group in the parish family. The important thing is to get resources and use them to better form your parishioners. Family home prayer is a good beginning.

Service:

This is the area where most parishes excel in. St. Pius X Outreach Ministry, food pantry has donated food to hundreds of families over the years. Social (Homebound) and Event Ministry are the most rewarding and fun events of our parish.

The Liturgical Committee which coordinates scheduling of altar servers, lectors, ushers, Extraordinary Ministers of the Precious Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ, is an important working committee which needs your help.


